DRAMA TEACHER NOTES

Group discussion

- Why does Miss Ryan ask the students to care for an egg over the weekend?
- Early in the play, Mr Osmetti says: 'Fail life skills? Nobody fails life skills, Ruth.' Miss Ryan is surprised to hear this. Why does Mr Osmetti believe that nobody fails life skills?
- Compare and contrast the home lives of Bella and Hannah.
- Look at the clues in the script about the changes in location. For example, on page 7, we know Bella has arrived home because she dumps her bag on the floor and calls out to her Mum. Find another example and explain how the audience knows what the location is.
- What do any two of the characters learn about themselves from the experience of caring for their eggs?

Improvisation

Work with a partner and present a short scene in which you find a very unusual egg. What hatches out of it?
